### WHAT WE'LL DISCUSS (CDBG-ELIGIBLE CONCEPTS)

- Water, sewer, and drainage improvements (where eligible)
- Public facility improvements that improve accessibility and service to residents (where eligible)
- Community facilities improvements serving residents (where eligible)
- Public services (limited and where eligible)
- Planning activities that directly support eligible community development efforts
- Housing-related activities are limited to eligible CDBG activities such as demolition and water/sewer connections to private property (where eligible)

*All input will be reviewed for CDBG eligibility, feasibility, and competitiveness under SC CDBG requirements.*

### CLARIFICATION OF SCOPE

This meeting is held to gather community input to help identify and prioritize potential activities that may be eligible for funding under the South Carolina CDBG (State) grant program, with emphasis on activities that benefit low- and moderate-income (LMI) persons and areas, consistent with program requirements.

Input received will be used to support the community's CDBG needs assessment and potential grant application development. This meeting is specific to the CDBG program and is separate from the jurisdiction's Comprehensive Plan, capital improvement planning, and other community planning or engagement efforts. To keep the discussion aligned with CDBG requirements, comments are requested on needs and project ideas that relate to potential CDBG-eligible activities. Questions or concerns that fall outside CDBG scope may be directed to the appropriate office.
